## Rainsticks



## What You Need:

- 1 Paper towel roll or an aluminum foil roll
- A sheet of colorful construction paper
- A piece of aluminum foil
- A piece of plastic wrap
- A tablespoon of dried beans or popcorn kernels
- Tape
- Markers or any other coloring utensils
- Stickers (optional)
- Ribbon (optional)

## Instructions

- 1. Begin by drawing pictures, shapes, or any design of your choosing on one side of a colored sheet of paper. Hold onto this decorated construction paper you will add it in step 5.
- 2. Next, crumple up a long thin piece of aluminum foil and insert into the roll. The aluminum foil will serve as a barrier to keep either the beans or popcorn kernels from moving to quickly. This step will allow the contents in the tube to travel at a slow rate, thereby creating a rainfall sound.
- 3. Place a doubled-up piece of plastic wrap over one end of the roll and then tape it in place.
- 4. Pour a tablespoon of dry beans or popcorn kernels into the open end of the roll, then proceed to seal that end with a doubled-up piece of plastic wrap. Finish it off once again by taping plastic wrap to secure it in place.
- 5. Tape decorated paper that you have already created in step 1 and begin to slowly wrap around the tube, securing the end with tape. (Note, only about 1/3 of the end of the actual paper will show once wrapped around a paper towel roll if using one.)
- 6. Continue to decorate your rainstick by adding stickers, tape, or ribbon. Remember to tip your rainstick back and forth to enjoy that sweet sound of a rainfall!
