Primary Art Activities

Nature's Colors

<u>Watch Ms. Skor's video</u> to learn about the colors of the rainbow and watch her paint with things she found outside!

Investigate colors that you find in nature and review the colors of the rainbow with this book. Read <u>Colors in Nature</u> together with this virtual book provided by the Epic website.

Rainbow Scavenger Hunt

Now that you know the colors of the rainbow, go on a scavenger hunt around the house. Can you find something to match each color and make a rainbow of your own?



Nature's Pigments

Paint with nature! Go on a hunt outside to find some things of different colors to try painting with - grass, leaves, flowers, berries, dirt, sticks, anything you want to try. With some thick paper, experiment to get the pigment out of your natural resources. Rocks and spoons are great tools for grinding.



Make Land Art

Some artists create art outside for specific places using natural materials. Make your own land art using whatever you can find outside. Make a stack of rocks, or a stick picture. You can even incorporate ice into your sculpture and watch how the environment and time changes your work of art.



Make Fossils

Watch Ms. Skor's video to see how she made fossils using salt dough and plastic animals. Salt dough recipe: 1 cup flour, ½ cup salt, ½ cup warm water, added slowly, mixed and kneaded to get a dough consistency.
